

C goes with a, o, and u! K goes with the other two (i and e)



Goes with the song:

C goes with a, o, and u. K goes with the other two (i and e).

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To decide if you use a c or k when you hear the /k/ sound, look at the letter immediately after.

Example: cat - The letter a comes after the /k/ sound, so a c is used.

Example: kite - The letter i comes after the /k/ sound, so a k is used.

*After the letter y has been taught as a vowel, you will add y to the k.

When there is a consonant in between the letter c and the vowel, the c will always sound like /k/ but may not follow the cat kite rule.
